

SET Careers programme (updated 2022)

SET careers programme now works to the New CDI Career Development Framework with its 6 interlinked learning areas and related SMART learning outcomes. The Framework provides a holistic approach to 'career' learning that embraces the many aspects of a student's life and learning that will impact on their career. It requires the careers programme to be firmly embedded in the curriculum and the school's culture, with every member of staff engaged. The Framework embraces the importance of developing awareness, curiousity, skills and reflective practice, whilst ensuring that all eight Gatsby Benchmarks are understood and met across the whole programme.

The SET careers programme works with the SET PSHE curriculum to deliver key targets set by the Cambridgeshire PSHE personal development framework around financial capability (economic wellbeing) and careers and employability.
